Objectives

In Tunisia, **Presidential** measures aimed at integrating all social categories in the information and knowledge society granting everyone the possibility to be informed, to express oneself and to make the most of one's potential in view of ensuring a better insertion in professional and social life, have gained considerable ground. Indeed and with a view of guaranteeing the access to administrative e-services to all categories and notably the disabled, **President Zine El Abidine Ben Ali** gave instructions on February 14, 2007, to upgrade websites relative to administrations and public institutions, so that access to these sites in conformity with international norms, is facilitated. This **presidential** measure incites us, today to organize, for public and private bodies, training sessions on accessibility to the web while respecting the international norms of digital accessibility (W3C/WAI).

These training sessions will be organized by the ATTR in cooperation with BrailleNET-France Association, within the framework of their partnership agreement with the following objectives:

1. Improving and harmonizing understanding of the fundamental concepts of web accessibility of computer professionals in Tunisia
2. Harmonizing their understanding of the fundamental concepts of web accessibility, as well as the normative framework provided by W3C
3. Developing accessibility evaluation skills of online services following W3C, recommendations and the AccessiWeb methodology
4. Enabling these professionals to develop online services in conformity with W3C recommendations
5. Progressively set up a competency pole of web accessibility in Tunisia , capable of organizing trainings and proposing AccessiWeb labeling audits
